§ 5(1)(b)	Rules for the implementation of the student's obligation to participate in particular types of classes	1. Attendance at all classes, including elective classes chosen by the student, is compulsory, irrespective of the mode of delivery of the classes. 2. The rules governing attendance will be communicated by the lecturer during the first class and will also be specified in the subject syllabus by the coordinator.
§ 5(1)(c) § 53.9	Scope and conditions of conducting classes, knowledge or skills tests and diploma examinations in a foreign language and preparing diploma theses in a foreign language	1. Degree programmes may include classes taught in a foreign language. 2. Classes taught in a foreign language are subject to the same general requirements and regulations as classes taught in Polish. 3. Individual teaching sessions within subjects taught in Polish may be conducted in a foreign language, however, the assessment of learning outcomes is carried out in Polish. 4. Degree examinations for theses prepared in a foreign language are conducted either in the language in which the thesis was written or in Polish. The decision regarding the language of the degree examination is made by the vice-dean for teaching upon the recommendation of the thesis supervisor.
§ 5(1)(d)	The assessment period for full-time and part-time BA and MA studies, as well as long-term MA studies, organised either by semester or by academic year	For part-time programmes offered by the Faculty of Philosophy and History, the assessment period is one semester, subject to the rules governing the granting of an individual organisation of studies for a semester or an academic year, as specified in § 34(3) of the UL Rules of Study.
§ 5(1)(e)	Admissibility and conditions for repeating the first semester or year of study	Students may repeat a semester at any stage of their studies.
§ 5(1)(f)	Maximum number of academic hours and maximum number of examinations per academic year	1. The maximum annual number of academic hours is 750. 2. The maximum number of examinations in an academic year is 8.

§ 5(1)(g)	Minimum average grade in the course of study to date allowing for an individual study timetable and programme (IPS)	Minimum grade average in the course of study to date allowing to apply for an individual study timetable and programme (IPS) is 4.5.
§ 5(1)(h) § 41	Conditions of admissibility and procedure for resolving a student's appeal against a decision to refuse credit for a course/component classes	1. A student who is refused credit for a subject or a component assessed by way of a pass/fail credit may, within seven days of the grade being entered into the USOS system, lodge an appeal with the vice-dean for student affairs. The appeal must demonstrate a breach of the assessment requirements or procedures specified in the syllabus, or other serious irregularities. 2. The vice-dean for student affairs makes a decision after hearing both the student and the academic staff member who awarded the grade.
§ 5(1)(i)	Mandatory form of the thesis, subject to § 52(2)	1. The forms of thesis are specified in the UL Rules of Study. 2. A thesis must be prepared as part of a seminar and must satisfy the learning outcomes specified for the relevant seminar. 3. A thesis must include a description of its research assumptions and methodology, a bibliography, and a table of contents.
§ 5(1)(j)	Scope of requirements for the diploma examination	1. The scope of the degree examination may not extend beyond the academic discipline or disciplines to which the degree programme under which the examination is conducted is assigned. 2. Only the thesis supervisor, the reviewer, and the chairperson of the examination committee are entitled to ask questions during the examination. The student's responses to the questions posed by the supervisor and the reviewer are assessed.
§ 5(1)(k)	Procedure for conducting open diploma examinations	1. Open diploma examinations are conducted in accordance with § 58(6) of the UL Rules of Study. 2. An open diploma examination may be held outside the university's premises, provided that a notice is published on the faculty's website at least seven days before the scheduled examination date. 3. During an open diploma examination, only the thesis supervisor, the reviewer, and the chairperson of the examination committee are entitled to ask questions.

		The student's responses to the questions posed by the supervisor and the reviewer are assessed.
§ 5(2)(a)	The maximum number of repeated semesters/academic years, including repetitions resulting from resumption, on degree programmes offered by the Faculty; and the maximum period that may elapse following removal from the student register during which learning outcomes achieved in previous studies may still be recognised	The maximum number of semester repetitions permitted is two. The maximum number of reinstatements to studies is two. If a student resumes their studies following reinstatement, they may repeat a semester no more than once. Learning outcomes achieved during previous studies may be recognised only if no more than five years have elapsed between the student's removal from the register of students and their reinstatement.
§ 5(2)(b)	Minimum number of ECTS credits or minimum number of courses allowing a student to pass a semester/year conditionally and to be enrolled in the next semester/year of study	Conditional progression to the next semester may be granted only in justified cases. It may not relate to more than two single-component subjects in a semester or one multi-component subject. In the latter case, conditional progression may be granted where the student has received a failing grade in the examination and, as a consequence, has not obtained credit for the subject.
§ 5(2)(c)	Applicable sequence of subjects	1. The Faculty of Philosophy and History does not prescribe a mandatory sequence of subjects, except for subjects delivered over at least two semesters. 2. Permission to undertake simultaneously subjects delivered over at least two semesters is decided on an individual basis by the vice-dean for student affairs upon the student's application and after obtaining the opinion of the lecturer responsible for the subject.
§ 5(2)(d)	Mandatory subjects without passing of which a student may not be enrolled in the next semester/year of study, regardless of the score	1. Thesis seminars are compulsory subjects which must be successfully completed before a student may be enrolled on the next semester or academic year of study, regardless of the number of ECTS credits obtained (i.e. such subjects are not eligible for conditional progression). 2. The above limitation does not apply to enrolment in a given year of study with the completion of programme differences, in connection with § 20.2 of the UL Rules of Study.

§ 5(2)(e)	Rules for the transfer of students from full-time to part-time studies or from part-time to full-time studies other than those set out in § 23 of these Rules; rules applicable to the whole faculty or to individual majors	No rules governing transfers from full-time to part-time studies, or vice versa, other than those provided for in § 23 of the UL Rules of Study, are applicable at the faculty.
§ 5(2)(e¹)	Rules for transferring students from other higher education institutions other than those set out in § 25 of the Rules of Study	No rules governing transfers from other higher education institutions, other than those provided for in § 25 of the UL Rules of Study are applicable at the faculty or within individual degree programmes.
§ 5(2)(f)	ECTS credit conversion rates for individual programmes and specialities where the exchange of students with foreign or national institutions does not guarantee the equivalence of student achievements	1. No general ECTS credit conversion scale is established for individual degree programmes or specialisations in cases where student exchange arrangements with foreign or domestic higher education institutions do not ensure the equivalence of students' academic achievements. 2. In the cases referred to in section 1, decisions regarding the conversion of ECTS credits are made individually by the vice-dean for student affairs, following consultation with the International Centre of the UL. Such decisions are guided primarily by the student's best interests and the principle of maximum recognition of academic achievements.
§ 5(2)(g)	Possibility to apply from the first semester in the MA programme for an individual study timetable and programme (IPS)	Students in the first semester of an MA degree programme are not eligible to apply for an individual study timetable and programme (IPS).
§ 5(2)(h)	Rules for the completion of a course of study other than those set out in § 38(7) and (8)	No rules other than those provided for in § 38(7) and § 38(8) of the Rules of Study apply to the recognition of modules towards the continuation of studies.

§ 5(2)(i)	Rules for obtaining credit and taking examinations other than those set out in § 38(9) of these Rules	No rules other than those provided for in § 38(9) of the Rules of Study apply to obtaining credits or taking examinations.
§ 5(2)(j)	Additional designations or examples of written work fulfilling the requirements of the thesis, in addition to those indicated in § 52	none
§ 5(2)(k)	Extension of the period of interruption in the study programme indicated in § 54(5) authorising the student to be exempted from compensating for differences in the study timetable and programme	If a student was previously removed from the register of students due to failure to submit a dissertation/thesis within the deadline specified in § 54(5) of the Rules of Study, the maximum interruption of studies that may qualify the student for exemption from making up differences in the curriculum and programme of study is five years.
